

News from the Pastor's Desk

It's ok to Disagree!

One of the things I truly appreciate about being a Presbyterian is our right to disagree. Everyone is entitled to express their opinions and have their say. I can remember the first time I went to a Presbytery meeting and there was a debate over something or the other. Both lay and clergy were passionate about their views and were standing firm on their positions. After the meeting, those very same people who were on opposite ends of the spectrum were confirming lunch plans, sharing about their families or moved on to a completely different topic. They expressed their opinions and had their say in the meeting and afterwards moved on. It was amazing to me how they didn't allow their differences to severe or negatively impact their relationships.

These differences in theology and polity are at the heartbeat of a reformed faith tradition. I feel empowered knowing that I have voice and vote. I know that my comments, have at times, made a difference in the way someone who may have been undecided or even firm on their position, caused them to look again at their stance from a different perspective. I have come to understand that there is great wisdom in diversity. Our Book of Order states in F-1.0403: "The unity of believers in Christ is reflected in the rich diversity of the Church's membership." There is also another term called Mutual Forbearance in F-3.0105. I appreciate this as well because it anticipates that when a group of people get together (committee) to create, plan and

do the work of the church, there will be differences. We were all uniquely created in God and we should come to expect that we will respond differently. If we all agree all the time about everything, we should be suspicious because this could mean that someone is hindered or may not feel the space is safe to be their authentic self.

For me, mutual forbearance means you don't cut and run when you don't get your way. It means that I don't have to think like you all the time to love you. It means that we respect one another and as mature Christians because our goal is not to win and be right. The goal is to be one with Christ by joining together with all those whom Christ calls into relationship with him. This means we pray for one another, we fellowship together by sharing our lives with one another and we don't allow differences to divide us. Differences can ultimately lead to deeper relationships and deeper communities. Differences are sometimes disguised as opportunities to grow in our faith. Let's face it, we are not all children. We can expect them to get angry and stomp off when they aren't getting their way.

Disagreements happen all the time with family, friends and co-workers and yet we often manage to hold on those relationships. We are reformers and agents of change. Being a reformer means we must exhibit love, patience and forbearance with one another because change is rarely a quick process. It's not always easy, but anything is possible with God on our side.


